Education, Training & Licenses:

While in the Marines, Bill provided security to American embassies in Ankara, Turkey, and Mexico City. He then was on special assignment for six months in West Africa with the U.S. Department of State. Bill began his career with the Euless Police Department as a Public Service Officer. He transferred to the position of Police Officer in June, 1991 and promoted to Corporal in July, 1995. While in the Police Department, he has also worked on the Bicycle Patrol, in CID, and on the Narcotics Task Force. He is currently assigned to the Patrol Division as a Field Training Officer, and is a member of the Northeast Tarrant County Area SWAT Team (NETCAST) as a sniper and entry team operator.

Bill has received several letters of commendation. In October 1991, he received a commendation from the US Marshall's Office for his assistance in apprehending a federal fugitive.
