SUBJECT: Trinity River Authority (TRA) Interlocal Agreement

ACTION REQUESTED:

Consider authorizing the City Manager to execute an Interlocal Agreement between the City of Euless and the Trinity River Authority to transfer operation and maintenance of 4,900 linear feet of existing 12-inch to 15-inch diameter sanitary sewer pipeline known as the Cyclone Creek Trunk Outfall. The agreement also authorizes the Trinity River Authority to utilize the City's Drainage and Utility Easements for the planning, design, construction, maintenance, and installation of a new 15-inch to 24-inch diameter pipeline to replace the existing Cyclone Creek Trunk Outfall Pipeline.

SUMMARY OF SUBJECT:

The City of Euless entered into a contract with the Trinity River Authority effective September 11, 1973, in which the City granted the Trinity River Authority the use of a wastewater transmission line known as the Cyclone Creek Trunk Outfall. At this time, the Trinity River Authority no longer needs the use of those facilities by reason of replacement of said lines with a new sanitary sewer interceptor pipeline known as the WF-10 and WF-13 Pipeline Improvements Project. The new pipeline will be located within the City's drainage and utility easement along Cyclone Creek, north of State Highway 10 and south of State Highway 183, all within the City limits.

Therefore, the Trinity River Authority is proposing the transfer of the existing 12-inch to 15-inch diameter pipelines back to the City for use as a collector line that will feed into the new transmission line. By entering into this agreement, the City will assume full responsibility for the operation and maintenance of the 12-inch to 15-inch pipeline. This segment of pipeline extends from approximately the confluence of Cyclone and Hurricane Creek and ends on the north right of way of State Highway 183. Before transfer, the Trinity River Authority will rehabilitate the existing 12-inch to 15-inch pipeline as part of the WF-10 and WF-13 projects.
