The volunteers will be here from 4:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. on Tuesday evenings and from 12:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. Saturday afternoons. Look for the large Uncle Sam to find the tax forms. 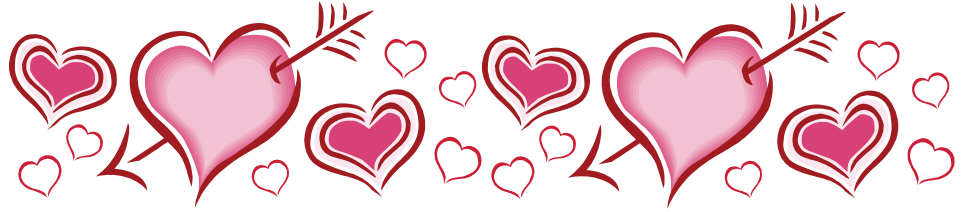
