### April Computer Classes

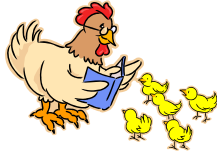

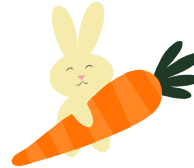

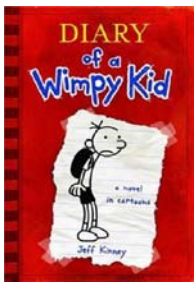
