Ke Anuenue Polynesian Revue Monday, August 10th 7:00 P.M.

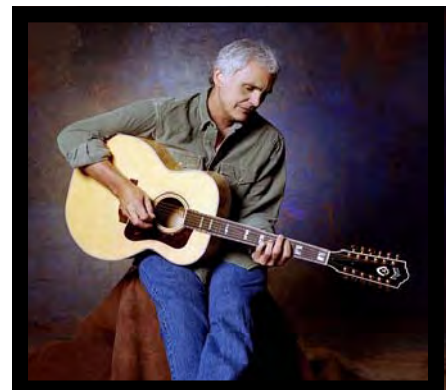
