## Valentine Day Trivia

Approximately 1 billion Valentine's Day cards are exchanged on February 14th each year.

Teachers will receive the most Valentine's Day cards, followed by children, mothers, wives, and then sweethearts.

Children ages 6 to 10 exchange more than 650 million Valentine's cards with teachers, classmates, and family members.

110 million roses, the majority red, will be sold and delivered within a 3-day time period.

The red rose was the favorite color of Venus, the Roman goddess of love.

73% of people who buy flowers for Valentine's Day are men, while only 27% are women. However, 15% of U. S. women send themselves flowers on Valentine's Day.

The Italian city of Verona, where Shakespeare's lovers Romeo and Juliet lived, receives approximately 1000 letters addressed to Juliet every Valentine's Day.

The most fantastic gift of love is the Taj Mahal in India built by Mughal Emperor Shahjahan as a memorial to his third wife.
