We have been extremely busy over the last few weeks working on our department budget and getting ready for the Driver/Engineer promotion test which starts on Monday, April 8.

A few items that are noteworthy in no particular order of importance are:

We have a badge pinning on April 24th for our 6 newest firefighters. Toby Clower, Rob Butler, Cody Hughes, Kyle McNeese, Matt Sanders and Michael Troth will receive their firefighter badges for completion of 1 year of service in good standing.

Additionally, we have two new firefighters coming aboard to fill recent vacancies. Anthony Crabb from Iowa and Brandon Schroeder from Colleyville are excited to start their new jobs as Eules Firefighters on the 15th of April. They will work 8-5 for 2-3 weeks for orientation before being assigned to shift work.

Our guys and gal will be participating in firefighter survival training in Grapevine during April as well.

Some stats for the year so far through March:

1016-total emergency calls which is slightly behind this time last year 1062.
5-structure fires with over 2.5 million dollar loss to date for the year.
Firefighters average 20+ hrs. a month in EMS and Fire training.

Fire Station #2 was burglarized on Monday, April 8. While the guys were exercising in the bay with the doors open a man walked in and stole all the wallets. The police did catch him but didn't recover all the stolen items.



THE TOOL BOX:

Notes on Fire Safety from the Euless Fire Department

Many of us have a tool drawer in the kitchen. Others have a small toolbox in the garage or some other handy place to retrieve a tool for a quick repair or installation. In our own way we all have tools around our home essential for making day-to-day repairs or hanging pictures in the home. Would you consider having only a screwdriver? How about only a hammer? No, you probably wouldn't. One tool alone would not be very helpful on many occasions.

The same holds true for your family's fire safety. Fire extinguishers, smoke alarms, good fire prevention habits, safety knowledge and an effective escape plan are some of the tools necessary for your fire safety. Any one of these tools is good. Alone they may not be as effective but, used together they make an impressive home fire safety "tool box".

Battery-operated, single station smoke alarms became available to the public in the 1960s. Fire safety experts recommended installing one outside each sleeping area. During the 1980s local codes began requiring hardwired alarms installed outside each sleeping area. They did not have a battery back-up. By the 1990s local codes required hardwired alarms with battery back-up. By the 2000s almost all local codes required smoke alarms outside each sleeping area, inside each bedroom, hardwired, with a battery back-up and interconnected so that when one went off they all went off.

Scientific studies were proving that from the time a fire reached the flaming stage, one might have less than four minutes to escape a burning home before a dangerous flashover occurred. Interconnected alarms are providing earlier notification of a fire and giving us more precious seconds to escape. This is an example of how one tool has been improved over the years.

Now, couple that "improved tool" with others such as a well thought-out and practiced home escape plan and a good understanding of fire behavior you will have greatly improved your chances of escaping a fire in your home.

Create and maintain a well-stocked fire safety "toolbox" to protect you and your family from the danger of uncontrolled fire at home and away from home.
