

Message from the ECPAAA President:

TCPAAA CONFERENCE July 20 - 22, 2006

The conference held in Richardson, Texas. This year was the best I had attended thus far. The Garland Citizens Police Academy Alumni Association and the Richardson Citizens Police Academy Alumni Association worked together to produce this conference. Following are some highlights.

We were welcomed by Chief Larry Zacharias of Richardson; Chief Mitch Bates of Garland was on jury duty and could not join us until Saturday. Chief Zacharias' keynote address was about the "Takeover Bandits." He described how these bandits had robbed several banks and showed a video of the dramatic chase that followed one robbery. The chase involved police officers from different locales. Although the quality of the video taken from the police cameras was not always the best, no one's attention wavered from the screen. The miracle was that no officer was seriously hurt. Several of the officers involved in the chase were able to join us for a few moments.

The luncheon keynote speaker was Judge Vic Cunningham, a former Dallas County prosecutor. He had presided over five of the trials that involved the "Texas 7" escapees. This is the group who escaped from Huntsville and traveled through various parts of Texas and Oklahoma, killing Police Officer Aubrey Hawkins of Irving, before being captured weeks later in Colorado.

NASA Astronaut Jim Reilly, FBI SSRA Pete Galbraith and FBI SSRA Jeff Millsagle talked about the Columbia Space Shuttle Recovery in East Texas. Reilly described the shuttle and how NASA re-

sponded to the loss of the astronauts and the shuttle. NASA's first priority was to recover the bodies of the crew, and they enlisted the assistance of the FBI in this effort. Galbraith and Millsagle described how they coordinated the efforts of other police organizations and civilians to ensure the recovery of the bodies. Once they were certain they had recovered all human remains, they then focused on recovering the shuttle. Their descriptions were riveting.

Friday's luncheon focused on the assassination of President John F. Kennedy. Dr. Phillip Williams was an intern at Parkland and was taken there and described what he had observed during that horrible day. Retired Dallas Detective Jim Leavelle spoke about his attempt and success in capturing the man suspected of killing a police officer in Oak Cliff, only to learn later that Lee Harvey Oswald was also suspected of fatally shooting President Kennedy and wounding Governor Connally. Leavelle was handcuffed to Oswald when he was shot by Jack Ruby. Former Dallas Prosecutor Bill Alexander prosecuted Jack Ruby for the murder of Lee Harvey Oswald. His commentary was both colorful and informative. It is my understanding that he is convinced that if the investigation had been handled by the local police, and if the autopsy had been performed by the local coroner, there would be fewer rumors and questions regarding the President's death.

Several of us went to Dallas to tour the 6th Floor Museum at the Schoolbook Depository Building. This was an emotional experience for me. Seeing some of the news reports and hearing the news commentaries that I had heard all those years ago brought back memories and pain. Yes, I still remember where I was and what I was doing when I heard of the assassination.

Saturday I attended the two sessions focusing on the Darlie Routier murder case. Lt. David Nabors described the investigation of the killing of Routier's children, and the collection of the forensic evidence that convinced them that Darlie Routier was responsible for the deaths of her sons. He also played the 9-1-1 call she had placed. Former Dallas Prosecutor Greg Davis described the trial and the appeal process that is still active. He also talked about her husband and their relationship.

Needless to say, this conference, which provided many learning experiences for us all, ended on a fun note. We participated in a murder mystery with two separate "murders." I wish I could say that we who shared a table solved the murders, but alas and alack, we did not. We weren't even close, but we had a lot of fun trying. All in all, attending the conference was time well spent. It also gave us the opportunity to get to know our new Liaison Officer David Chaney; he and Officer David Parker joined us at the conference, but work kept them away from the closing mystery. I'm sure we would have solved the murders had they been there.

Speaking of liaison officers, let us remember Gary Landers, who is still with us and will always be in our hearts. We will be having an ice cream social on his behalf during our next alumni meeting. So if you want to bring nibbles and such, feel free to do so!
