



Thanks again to our Alumni Association for arranging this opportunity for our membership to learn and save money.


#### Senior Auto Drivers (Age 50 and Over)

Would you spend \$10 to save about \$299 to \$300 over three years (\$65 to \$100 per year)? You can by attending the AARP Driver Safety program at a cost of \$10. It is an 8-hour

lecture program in two half-day sessions. The course reviews rules of the road, accident prevention and compensating for the effects of aging on driving performance (decline in vision/ hearing/ reaction time). A driver must be age 50 or over to attend the course. No tests! And AARP membership is not required. Upon completion of the course you will receive a Certificate of Completion which you submit to your insurance company and receive a discount of up to 10% off your automobile insurance premiums for three years. The discount received depends on the amount and types of coverage.

Note: this discount may not be available to drivers insured by a County Mutual company or other driver high-risk insurance pool. Also, this program is not currently licensed as a traffic ticket dismissal course in Texas.
