



Hello all! I want to thank all the members for the warm reception to this new position. I have hit the ground running. Citizens Police Academy #24 is well underway and seems to be going very well. We are gearing up for the next CERT class which will begin when this CPA class ends.

I have been assigned to a project out of City Hall called Hometown Project. This program is designed to assist lower income homeowners that are unable to fix their house. This project is being funded through a HUD grant administered by Tarrant County. This is an effort at revitalizing our residential areas in order to maintain property values.

For the Police Department's role, I have recommended that we start in the Wilshire neighborhood to build a model for success. I am recommending we build our neighborhood watches for two purposes. The first being to reduce crime in the neighborhood, and the second is for closer community contacts to help us identify those that might fit into the program.


Here is where the role of the alumni association comes in. I have received a grant application from Met Life that I am working on. There are actually two grants that will be applied for. Both require partnership with a 501(c)(3) organization to manage the money. I have spoken with Denise about the alumni association managing the funds, and there appear to be no problems with continuing the application. The first grant application appears to fit with the Hometown Project, as part of neighborhood revitalization. The second application will be monies for applied technology money. My thought with the second application, if we can win, would be to apply some of the money to Amateur Radio Euleless for equipment.

For those that are unfamiliar with this program, Amateur Radio Euleless are private radio operators. They have been a great assistance to the Police Department's

emergency operation function. This group participates with Tarrant County RACES, which assists in storm spotting. The National Weather Service relies on these storm spotters to supplement what is being read on the radar. When the emergency operations center is activated, members of this group come to the station and staff the radio equipment for The City. Members also assist at local events with the lost child function.

If either grant is successful, I will be seeking input from members for ideas as to how some of the resources can be spent.

Message from the President

February is National Heart Month. Did you know that physical inactivity is a major risk factor for cardiovascular disease, and most Americans are not physically active enough to gain any health benefits? Cycling, jogging, walking or many other activities can help your heart. All healthy adults ages 18-65 should be getting at least 30 minutes of moderate intensity activity five days of the week.

What does this have to do with the ECPAAA?

Suppose we each took a brisk 30-minute walk through our neighborhoods or city parks as part of our daily routines. Could 70 CPA members observe more than four officers on patrol? Could a 30-minute walk help keep our neighborhoods safe?

A 30-minute walk might be just what we need to meet the new family that moved in a few houses down or to converse with the young man who likes to work in his garage. Or to notice that the Joneses have been on vacation and have newspapers piling up on their doorstep or that Mrs. Smith's patio window is broken or to learn Susie's bike was stolen on Monday. Or that the slide at Bob Eden is broken or that teens are smoking at Midway Park Creek every day around 5:30.

Walks through our neighborhoods and parks will keep us aware of our surroundings, provide us with opportunities to connect with neighbors, and be proactive in creating safer communities by allowing us to notice and report suspicions to the police. All this and it's good for our hearts.
