



June 17, 2014**

EXECUTIVE BOARD MEETING — The meeting was called to order at 6:20 pm.

Captain Landers asked to have the \$10,000 that was allocated for the Honor Guard trip to Washington DC re-allocated to the Eules Police Department's Fitness Room. Since the Honor Guard could not make the trip to Washington DC, the team came to Captain Landers to ask if the money could be re-allocated to the Fitness Room which would benefit all employees in the Eules Police Department and Courts. The Crime Control Prevention District approved \$15,000 towards this project as well. Peggy made a motion to re-allocate the \$10,000 and Leah seconded the motion. Motion passed.

Captain Landers also spoke about the Memorial Stair Climb scheduled for September 6th in Dallas. Five police officers from Eules are on the team. The team is raising money to support the "Concerns of Police Survivors" charity in conjunction with the stair climb. Leah made a motion to donate \$1,000 to the team and Julie seconded the motion. Motion passed.

Julie made a motion to adjourn which was seconded by Leah. The meeting closed at 6:36 p.m.

GENERAL MEETING – The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. and opened with prayer and the Pledge.


