Message from the ECPAAA President: Rosemarie Stevens

There are three topics I would like to go over here, but I promise to be brief:

**Voting for By-Laws** – In addition to voting for officers for 2007, we will be voting on the by-laws that you have had to hear about for most of the year. There will be two parts to the voting; they will be shown separately on the ballot which will be handed out during the November meeting. The first item concerns the way we will handle future elections. We can continue to vote for officers as we have done in the past, both by mail and in person, or only those who attend the meeting when elections are held can vote. It's your decision. The second part of the vote concerns the by-laws themselves;

you can either accept the revised by-laws or you can reject them. Again, the choice is yours. We ask that you let the Board know your preference by voting.

**Volunteer Hours** – Volunteering means we are providing a service. For us, this means we are serving the Police Department, ECPAAA and the City of Eules. For example, we serve the Police Department when we help in the records room, water the plants and feed them; we serve the City when we help with the annual Christmas parade; we serve the organization when we assist with fund raising activities. The formal presentation is at 6:45 p.m. This is the time to explain the purpose of the fund raiser. Casino Night starts at 7:00 p.m. The silent Auction runs from 7:00 p.m. - 8:30 p.m. The less expensive red item auction closes at 9:00 p.m. The white item auction closes at 9:30 p.m., and the blue item auction closes at 10:00 p.m. The Casino Night closes with the raffle.



\$20.00 - 7,500	\$100.00 - 75,000


