
Together we are all working to make our city the FABLEULESS community we live and work in. Thank you to all our volunteers.



Volunteers of the Year Named for 2009

Eules relies upon the many hours that our supportive volunteers donate to make our programs, special events and facilities great! We are very fortunate to have a devoted group of citizens that continuously give back to our community. Volunteers assist the City in a variety of ways, often working long hours without pay or recognition, for the benefit of Eules. In turn, the City picks one person each year that embodies the very definition of a Volunteer to celebrate the dedication and service of these outstanding people and the difference they have made in the community.

Wes and Dianne Higdon and **6Stones Mission Network** were named the Volunteers of the Year for 2009 because of their extensive involvement with the Eules Revitalization program. The Higdons volunteered hundreds of hours of their time and talent to organize and lead volunteers during the past two years and have touched the lives of dozens of Eules residents. 6Stones Mission Network was the guiding force behind the ER Program. This local non-profit was formed after working with the ER program. They work with a coalition of churches, non-profit agencies and other entities to assist in meeting the needs of the community. They both worked together to coordinate the ER Blitz this past June when over 500 volunteers renovated 15 homes in just two days. Their dedication to Eules is truly helping to make a better community.



The Volunteer Business of the Year was awarded to **Dallas Gold and Silver** for their efforts to help those less fortunate in Euless. The staff adopted children from a local apartment complex and provided each of them with gifts during Christmas. Owner Richard Haag was nominated for his belief and dedication in giving back to the community.



The 2009 Youth of the Year was given to the **Trinity Girls Awareness Program (GAP)** club for their considerable support of the Euless Animal Shelter. The Trinity GAP Club is an all-girl community service club at Trinity High School in Euless. Their devotion is to the Euless Animal Shelter. These young ladies have worked tirelessly to facilitate over 200 adoptions, thereby reducing the euthanasia rate significantly. They also host fundraisers twice a year that have raised over \$5,000 to pay for over 100 dogs and cats vaccinations, spay and neutering and other medical needs. In addition, these teens foster the pets and spend their free time in the shelter to walk, groom and care for the pets that reside there.



The Lifetime Achievement Award is given to a person or persons in Euless that have given of their time and efforts to the City of Euless throughout their life. This year, the Lifetime Achievement Award has been presented to two individuals: **Joy Baldwin-Goodgame** and **Weldon Cannon**.

Joy Baldwin-Goodgame has been a part of the Euless community for years and is a “full-time” volunteer. She has collected school supplies for several years through AARP in Euless. She never hesitates to volunteer for anything and always does it with a genuine heart. Joy volunteers for the Trash Off, Easter events, Arbor Daze, Euless Revitalization, and the Christmas Parade. In addition, she is involved in the Library, Senior Center, the Parks Department, the Women’s Shelter and is active at First Baptist Church Euless. Joy has also donated a photo album from the turn of century and a typewriter in the Euless history and genealogy room for display. She is a true asset for our community.



Dr. Weldon Cannon is the grandson of one of the founding families in Euless. His grandparents established the Euless Nursery in 1897, which was recently designated a Texas Historical Marker by the Texas Historical Commission. Weldon was born in Euless, and graduated as salutatorian from Euless high school in 1951. Weldon, a professor emeritus at Temple College, has been a member of the Euless Historical Committee since its inception. He is devoted to the research and preservation of Euless history. Through three generations, the Cannon family has contributed significantly to the development of Euless and has had a special relationship with the city.



Our congratulations go out to all of this year’s winners. The dedication of our volunteers’ time and energy cannot be compared, and we appreciate their love and admiration for Euless. Thank you for your time and energy that you spend to help make Euless great!

The Employee of the Year award is highly revered and is given to an employee by their peers for their vision and leadership. Family Life Center Coming Soon

Renovations at the 26,000 square foot Midway Recreation Center are on track and are anticipated to be completed in May - just in time for summer camp and the opening of Midway pool! These renovations will provide more usable space for our recreational programs and activities. The newly renovated Midway Recreation Center will meet the needs of the community including the Americans with Disability Act (ADA) and energy efficiency standards. A second phase renovation will be complete in September and will include a new 5,600 square foot fitness center with brand new strength and cardio equipment.

The City of Euless has a popular senior program with games, education sessions, healthy meals and special events. The center serves as a social connection for seniors as well as a link to area resources and support agencies. A new 22,240 square foot Senior Center will be constructed east of the Midway Recreation Center and is scheduled to open in the winter of 2010.

The new state-of-the-art Euless Senior Center will be dedicated for senior use and will include a library, media room, computer room, classrooms, game rooms, a medical room and a catering kitchen with adjacent dining areas. The building will also feature a covered drive-through for citizen drop off for handicapped purposes and inclement weather. Senior citizen input during the planning process revealed the desire and expectation for future programming targeted toward a more active lifestyle with resources for fitness, nutrition and psychological well-being. The City of Euless considers its senior population a true asset, providing both economic and volunteer benefits to the entire community. The Senior Center will be a hub of activities and programs that aid in health, well-being and quality of life.

We would like to thank everyone who completed and mailed back their 2010 Census form. You have made an important impact on this community and the decisions that affect us all, and for that we are grateful. For those who haven't completed their form, it's not too late to participate in this easy, important and safe process. Households that do not respond may receive a replacement form in early April 2010. Census workers will visit households that do not return their form to take a count in person. Official U.S. Census workers will have a badge, a handheld device, a Census Bureau canvas bag and a confidentiality notice. If someone comes to your door without this identifying information, do not give them any information.

Census data will have an important impact on our community. Data will influence grant opportunities for our community and guide decisions about where to build new roads, schools, hospitals and more. Teen Court Seeks Volunteers

The Hurst-Eules-Bedford Teen Court, co-sponsored by the Cities of Hurst, Eules, and Bedford, is a deferred program that allows juveniles with Class C misdemeanor offenses, an alternative to the criminal justice system. Offenders' cases are presented to a jury of their peers by volunteer teen attorneys. Teen jury members assign a community service sentence and upon successful completion of the program, the offenders' cases are dismissed and removed from their record.

Apartment Inspection Program

With over 90 multi-family communities containing over 12,000 units, nearly half of Eules' population consists of multi-family property. Eules recently adopted a new apartment inspection program that will allow code enforcement officers to proactively identify issues and encourage management to maintain their property above and beyond the Minimum Housing Code standards. This Property Maintenance Inspection Program came to fruition after eighteen months of research, development, preparation and cooperation with our multi-family property community.

The City of Eules recently revised its Minimum Housing Standards Ordinance with the goal of improving the effectiveness and quality of inspections for our apartment community.






