Dear Citizens,
This month I'd like to highlight the importance of the Eules Development Corporation and explain the role that it plays in our City. The Eules Development Corporation was created in 1993 and funded by a half-cent sales tax approved by a vote of the citizens. The operations of the District are overseen by a seven-member Board of Directors, who are appointed by the City Council and who are tasked with promoting our parks, library services and economic development within the City.

The Eules Development Corporation finances projects that come under its jurisdiction. These projects are widespread. Past projects include economic development incentives, the Texas Star Sports Complex transformation, renovation of Carr Park and remodel of the Eules Public Library. Upcoming projects include improvements to Blessing Branch Park and improvements at the aquatic center as well as overall park enhancements throughout the City. The Eules Development Corporation's activities have provided significant enhancements for our City.

Fire Station One Update

The construction of the new Fire Station No. 1 is moving along nicely. The station, which broke ground in March of 2021, is scheduled to be fully complete in April 2022. The new station will replace the previous station that was used for almost 40 years. Fire Station No. 1 will provide for the City's current needs as well as accommodations to expand as future growth dictates.

“The re-opening of Eules Fire Station 1 will provide a strategically placed, state-of-the-art fire station with great equipment and well-trained firefighters to better respond to the growing needs of Eules,” said Fire Chief Chanc Bennett.

“This new facility will meet the needs of the citizens for the next 30 years,” said Assistant City Manager Wes Rhodes. “It's in a good, central location, and will allow us to maintain rapid response times.”

Show Your Heart Some Love

February is American Heart Month, when the nation spotlights heart disease, the No. 1 killer of Americans. In most cases, heart disease is preventable when people adopt a healthy lifestyle and get regular checkups.

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), you can lower your chances of getting heart disease by doing the following:

- Know your blood pressure. Uncontrolled blood pressure can lead to heart disease.
- Talk to your doctor about being tested for diabetes. Having uncontrolled diabetes raises your risk of heart disease.
- Quit smoking. If you don't smoke, don't start. If you do smoke, learn to quit.
- Ask your doctor about checking your blood cholesterol and triglycerides.
- Get at least 2 hours and 30 minutes of moderate-intensity physical activity a week.
- Make healthy food choices. Being overweight raises your risk of heart disease.
- Limit how much alcohol you drink to one drink a day.
- Manage stress levels by finding healthy ways to cope with stress.

Being kind to your heart doesn't have to be hard. The City of Euless has many resources and amenities to help you improve your physical and emotional health. For your physical wellbeing, there are parks and walking/biking trails, indoor and outdoor pools, fitness machines, racquetball and basketball courts, softball fields, indoor walking track, pickleball court, gym and even a golf course. There are classes for Zumba, Pilates, yoga, water aerobics, swimming, dancing, Taekwon-Do, boxing cardio and more.

For your emotional wellbeing, check out the fun and educational opportunities provided by the Parks Department, the Senior Center and the Library. There are stress-lowering events like scavenger hunts, outdoor concerts and Heritage Park tours, as well as engrossing senior programs that include art and craft classes, competitive games and group outings.
