Even shabby clothes and threadbare textiles can be recycled into something useful, such as wiping cloths. According to the Secondary Materials and Recycled Textiles Association (SMART), 95% of used apparel and household textiles can be recycled or repurposed. This means that your clothing, bedding, towels, curtains and even stuffed animals can be recycled.

Of course, used electronics (working or not), should never be placed in the garbage. Instead, drop off used cell phones, computers and other electronic gadgets at your local Staples or Best Buy store, where they can be recycled. Check out their websites to see what items they accept.

- \$10 deposit per week (non-refundable/transferable) - due May 3
- Residents - \$165 per week (includes \$10 deposit)
