

Tiered Water Rates

In an effort to plan for future water supplies and promote water conservation, the City of Euless has a tiered water rate that encourages efficient water use.

Water conservation is important year round, but especially during hot Texas summers. The more water you conserve, the lower your monthly bill. The tiered structure charges more as consumption increases.


Garbage & Recycling

A Tree City for the past 27 years, Euless was the first city in Texas to provide recycling service to apartments and a hybrid recycling program for single-family homes. Euless' recycling program has received awards from the U.S. Conference of Mayors for composting and the Tarrant County Corporate Recycling Council for our comprehensive recycling program.

Residential garbage service is provided by Allied Waste Services twice a week.

Residential recycling service is provided by Community Waste Disposal once a week. You can choose the method of recycling that works best for you:

Permits, Registration & Transportation

Garage Sales

Eules residents seeking to hold a garage sale must first obtain a permit. An application form must be filled out and returned to the Development Office at 201 N. Ector Dr., with a \$5 fee. This fee can be paid with either cash, debit card, Visa or MasterCard.

Up to four yard signs will be given once the permit is granted. Homemade signs are not allowed. Those applying for a garage sale permit can opt to have their upcoming sale advertised on our website.

Pet Registration

Registering your dog or cat will allow Eules Animal Services to quickly notify you if your pet is lost. You do not have to bring the pet to the Animal Shelter in order to register it.

Registration can take place online or over the phone by calling 817-685-1594. Please be prepared to provide a current rabies tag number.

Once your pet is registered, you will receive an ID Tag for your pet with your pet's personal identification number. Voluntary registration is free. However, if the Animal Shelter picks up an unregistered pet, you will be charged a registration fee of \$10 before the dog or cat is released from the Animal Shelter.

An Animal Services Officer is on-call 24 hours a day in case of an emergency. To register, please visit www.eulesstx.gov/animal/register.

Alarm Permit

Annual registration is required for alarm permit holders. There is a fine for operating an alarm system without a permit. The residential alarm fee is \$30 (fee is waived if the permit holder is 65 or older). A business alarm fee is \$100.

Wheels Program

If a Euless resident is in need of medical transportation anywhere in Tarrant County, they can schedule a trip through the Wheels Program.

Wheels, primarily funded by United Way, is a donation-based program that assists anyone without transportation. The trips run from 5:30 a.m. – 4 p.m.

Area History

Eules — Our History, Our Past

In March 1879, Elisha Adam and Judy Trigg Eules purchased a tract of land south of Bear Creek and built a new home and a cotton gin in the area of present day Main Street and Eules Junior High School.

Eules has grown from a population of 25 in 1915 to a population of more than 50,000 in 2013.

McCormick Barn

The McCormick Barn, built in 1919, was built with wood from the Camp Bowie barracks after WWI ended. The barn was used to store hay & corn and eventually was used for a dairy business.

Mrs. McCormick donated the barn to the citizens of Eules and it was moved to Heritage Park in the summer of 2005. Bill Marquis, an expert in the art of restoration, was hired to restore the barn to its original state using authentic period-style materials and construction methods.

Fuller House

Providing a charming glimpse into the décor and lifestyle of the 1930s and 1940s, the Fuller House is a historical Eules landmark as the community's first brick house and now a museum.

In 1932, Homer and Edith Fuller built a new home in the 100 block of East Eules Blvd., next door to the Fuller Bros. grocery, at a cost of \$3,200. Its distinctive tan brick veneer was typical of fine homes of the 1920s and 1930s. Each brick was carefully removed and the house's frame interior moved to Heritage Park. The house was carefully restored and the original brick replaced.

Furnishings from the 1930s and 1940s, including original pieces donated by the Fuller family, have been placed in the restored house.

Explore the history of Eules. Tours are free on the second Saturday of every month from 1:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m.

In addition to the restored buildings, amenities include a playground, picnic area and a 1/2 mile walking trail. During the holiday season, come celebrate an old fashioned Christmas at historic Heritage Park. Members of the Eules Historical Preservation Committee conduct



guided tours of the buildings all decked out in their holiday best. Activities include local choirs, a petting zoo and great arts and crafts.



Himes Log House

The Himes Log House, probably built in 1851, is the oldest structure in Eules and one of the oldest in Tarrant County. It was likely the residence of Elisha Eules and of his mother-in-law, Mary Ann Trigg, who deserves credit as the real founder of the city.

The log house was typical for the time and place. Especially prevalent were large oak trees that furnished excellent logs for buildings, firewood, farm tools and household furnishings. The downstairs room was filled with a few simple household furnishings, such as a table or two, some chairs and a wood frame rope

bed with corn shuck mattress. The house was heated from a fireplace; there was no indoor plumbing.

The restoration project, supervised by Bill Marquis, took almost a year to complete. The house was faithfully restored in most details to its 1850s condition, even to the clay and straw chinking.

About 1,100 wood pegs were carved for the reconstruction. A chimney, typical for the times, was added, construction of small logs and fireproofed with 80 wheelbarrow loads of clay.

Amateur Radio Eules (ARE)

Amateur radio, also known as "ham radio" operators use their hobby for personal enjoyment in communicating with people across town or around the world. Operators around the country have also provided emergency communications in disaster situations. Amateur Radio Eules has participated in numerous local events such as Arbor Daze where members have assisted in locating lost children, during severe weather or emergency situations.

Citizens Police Academy (CPA)

The CPA will not train you to become a Police Officer, but it will give you valuable insight into the philosophy, strategies, and training that shape your Police Department.
